COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH INITIATIVE



Community Speed Watch is a voluntary scheme driven by members of the community and is supported by Police Scotland (Fife Division).

Essentially, it is a high visibility deterrent which strives to encourage motorists to reduce their speed, thus improving the safety and quality of lives of the local community.

The scheme runs during the summer months, so work is underway to have this up and



running again from April 2025.

We currently have 10 volunteers and are actively seeking more to join our initiative in keeping our roads a safer place. We have a further 2 people who have expressed an interest.

Community Engagement

Fife show is a traditional agricultural event held in Cupar which is well attended and a great family day out.

Officers attended this year's show providing crime prevention advice and promoting Take the Lead campaign.





Officers are reminding people enjoying the countryside to be considerate of wildlife and ground nesting birds, as allowing your dog to disturb, injure or kill wild birds or mammals, could be a wildlife crime offence.

Fife's Wildlife Crime Liaison Officer, Ben Pacholek, said: "Most of the visitors to Fife's countryside are mindful towards the resident wildlife, I'd ask that everyone keep a respectful distance from any wildlife and areas where birds might be nesting.

"Scotland's outdoor access code requires "Responsible Access", if you are walking your dog in an area where it is likely to encounter wildlife and ground nesting birds, please keep your dog under close control and ideally on a lead."

Calls Received (To end of May 2025)

Since 1st May 2025, Police have received 307 calls in the Howe of Fife and Taycoast area resulting in 31 crimes being recorded. This breaks down as follows:

Auchtermuchty

Freuchie

There is a slight increase to calls/crimes last month which relate to Road Traffic Matters.

Kettle (Kettlebridge, Kingskettle)

20 calls to the police which resulted in

1 recorded crime

Calls consisted of assist members of the public, road traffic matters and dishonesty.

Newburgh

80 calls to the police which resulted in

11 recorded crimes

Calls consisted of were road traffic matters, concern for persons and assist members of the public, dishonesty, disorder.

Monimail (Bow of Fife, Collessie, Monimail, Letham)
